WHAT ARE MAGNET SCHOOLS?

• Like magnets attract things, magnet schools attract students who want to learn about a specific theme.

Magnet School Themes:

- International Baccalaureate
- Leadership & Communications
- Creative & Performing Arts
- Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM)
- CCSD magnet programming increases student engagement and performance with hands-on and project-based learning.
 - Unique opportunities for learning like field trips, competitions, and performances.

All Creative & Performing Arts Programs

- Students in magnet art programs explore, experience, and produce art in its many forms.
- Students utilize the creative process to connect art with core subjects like reading, writing, and math.



Elementary & Middle School

- Elementary magnet art program students will explore, experience, and produce art in its many forms.
- Middle school magnet art programs allow students to concentrate and develop skills within one specific art specialty.



High School

Why IB?



IB is a global adventure in learning!

 IB students are inquiring, caring, lifelong learners who embrace each other's differences.

- In IB, students learn a new language and participate in arts,
 PE, AND design classes.
- IB helps students develop skills for real-world applications, which include exploring global challenges.
- IB prepares students for success in high school, college, and beyond!



STEM

Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) is everywhere from technology to skyscrapers, even predicting the weather and powering up video games.

Elementary & Middle School

- Learning opportunities for STEM are integrated into core subjects (reading, writing, and math).
- Collaboration and project-based learning is evident throughout the school day.

High School

- Students will concentrate and develop skills within one specific STEM specialty.
- Some STEM-based programs require students to meet academic criteria.



LEADERSHIP & COMMUNICATIONS

What is it?

• Leadership and communications is about working together and sharing ideas to make a difference - preparing all students for the future!


Students focus on responsibility, helpfulness, and effective communication.

Elementary & Middle School

 Students develop as leaders who take initiative, solve problems, collaborate with teams, and demonstrate their abilities to succeed.

High School

• Students will concentrate and develop skills within one specific area such as law, international leadership, law enforcement, etc.





Types of Magnet Schools

Full Magnet School

- Full magnet schools are dedicated entirely to a specialized curriculum, meaning all enrolled students participate in the magnet program.
 - All students must apply to attend
 - High School only-No athletics
 - Magnet students participate at zoned school
 - Southeast Career and Technical Academy is the only CTA with sports

Magnet Program Within a School

• A specialized thematic program is offered within a comprehensive school.

HOW TO ATTEND A MAGNET SCHOOL



Find Your Fit

Explore and research magnet school options through school-based open houses, workshops, shadow days, parent sessions, and community events.



Apply Online

Complete an application by the deadline, choosing up to three magnet schools or programs that best match your interests.



Selection

After the application deadline, applications are entered into the computerized, random lottery system to select students for available magnet seats.



After the lottery

- Create a parent/guardian account in the online application system called SchoolMint.
- A maximum of three schools/programs per applicant.
 - Choices ranked in order of preference
 - Additional selections are permitted in the late application if not selected in the initial lottery.
- Changes can be made until the application deadline

Sibling Preference

- The sibling must currently be enrolled in and attending the magnet school to which the applicant applies as their first choice on-time application.
- Concurrent enrollment in the upcoming school year Sibling = brother, sister, stepbrother, or stepsister living in the same household



Application Preferences



• The qualified applicant is currently enrolled in a magnet elementary or middle school when applying to an entry grade level at a magnet middle or high school.



Geographic Preference

• The qualified applicant lives in the magnet school's geographic preference area established by the CCSD Demographics & Zoning Department.



**If qualified applicants are twins/multiples and one twin/multiple is accepted through the general lottery, the other qualified twin/multiple will also be accepted into the school if they applied by the specified deadline. Applicants must apply to the same school.



Transportation

- Transportation preference is only given to Career & Technical Academy applicants.
- The qualified applicant lives within the established CTA transportation zone



Lottery & Acceptance

If there are more qualified applicants than seats available, the selection is completed through a computerized random lottery.

After the Lottery

- Parents/guardians notified of lottery status via email/text.
- Results available on the parent application dashboard.

Lottery Results

<u>Selected</u>

- The student has been chosen in the lottery.
- Parent/Guardian must log into the parent account and accept the seat by the specified deadline.
 - All other choice applications will be auto-declined upon accepting a selected seat, including
 Open Enrollment & Central Technical Training Academy applications.
- Schools will communicate "next steps" for registration.

Alternate Pool

- The number of applicants exceeded the number of available seats.
- The student remains in "alternate pool" status until if/when a seat becomes available until the second week of the following school year.

Not Qualified

- This status is only given for high school criteria-based and audition-based programs.
- The student does not meet the criteria required to be considered in the lottery for this magnet program.

Magnet Student Expectations

Selected students sign a Magnet Contract, agreeing to expectations for enrollment.

- The CCSD Magnet School becomes the student's "assigned" school.
- Students will remain enrolled in the magnet school for the entire school year.
- Students must maintain good attendance and demonstrate satisfactory behavior.
- Students must maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA.
- Students who do not follow the expectations outlined in the CCSD Magnet Contract may be placed on probation or dismissed from the magnet school.



TRANSPORTATION
